**Overnight Parking Regulations.** Overnight parking on all City streets is prohibited between 2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. Residents must contact the Police Department for permission to park on streets overnight due to driveway repairs or visitors. Overnight parking in City parking lots is restricted to residents with permits parking in designated spaces only. Parking citations must be paid at City Hall within 72 hours of the date the citation is written or the fines are doubled. Office hours are Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Payments may also be made using the drop boxes at City Hall. Call the Police Department at 543-1552, or 541-0767 after 5:00 p.m. and on weekends, for questions about parking and citations.

Parks Master Plan To Be Updated. The City's Parks Advisory Board and the Charlotte Area Recreation Cooperative, which represents the City, Eaton Township and Carmel Township, have joined to-

gether to update the 5-year parks master plan. As this planning effort gets underway, public input is being sought now through May 15. The 11-question survey, which takes only a few minutes to complete, asks which parks residents visit and their preferences for future recreation offerings, among other topics.
