**Lovett Street.** The reconstruction of 3 blocks of W. Lovett St. in downtown will continue through the summer.

**Budget Adoption.** City Council is expected to adopt the budget for the 2019-20 fiscal year and set 2019 millage rates during its June 10 meeting.

**Did You Know...** that it is a violation of City code to mow your yard such that grass clippings are deposited in the street? These clippings are unsightly and can lead to clogged storm drains. When mowing, direct the discharge chute away from the street or consider using a mulching mower to reduce yard waste.

**City Council Election.** City Clerk Ginger Terpstra has announced the availability of petitions to run for election to the City Council. In November, voters will elect a Mayor to a two-year term, three Council members to four-year terms, and one Council member to a two-year term. To be eligible for election, the individual must have been an elector of the City for not less than six months immediately prior to the election. Ward Council members must be residents of the ward from which they are elected. Petitions are available from the City Clerk's office during regular business hours and must be filed by 4:00 p.m. on July 23, 2019.
