RAVE ALERTS-UTILITY BILLING

The City of Charlotte uses Rave alerts to keep residents, business owners, everyone informed! Get notified with important information about what is happening in the community such as

street closures, water system work, or emergencies that may affect you. We also use the system to post other city information. Starting in July, we have expanded the service options to include targeted text and email messaging for quarterly utility billing. We will send out a notice to registered users when we send out the bills for their cycle area. This alert will notify them the bill has been mailed and provide other billing related information. There are several ways to register: Text CHARLOTTE to 67283; Download the Smart911 app; or Register for a free and secure safety profile online at Smart911.com.

NEWS FROM CITY HALL



August 2nd Primary. The City of Charlotte is conducting an election for the State Primary on August 2, 2022. Polls open 7:00 a.m. and close 8:00 p.m. for in-person voting.

Reminder: update your voter registration if you had any changes to your address, your name, or other personal information. If registering within 15 days of the election that you wish to vote in, including on election day, you must appear in person to the Clerk and bring proper residency and identity documentation.

An application for an absentee ballot must be submitted to obtain an absentee ballot. Applications are available now, apply as early as possible, the deadlines for absentee ballots for the August 2 election are below:

<u>Saturday July 29</u> is the last day a ballot can be mailed to you via first class mail if your application is received by the clerk before 5:00 p.m. On July 29th, the Clerk's office will be open 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. for the purpose of issuing absentee ballots only.

Monday August 1 an absentee ballot must be applied for and received in person at the Clerk's office until 4:00 p.m. Note: a ballot issued on this day cannot leave the building . You must vote the ballot and return it to the Clerk before leaving.

Return your voted absentee ballots to the Clerk at your earliest opportunity after voting it. All voted absentee ballots must be returned/received to the Clerk no later than 8:00 p.m. (close of polls) on election day August 2, 2022 to be processed in the election.

Two drop boxes are available at City Hall, 111 E. Lawrence, to deposit your applications and voted ballots: in the vestibule at the front door and drive up and drop off along N. From the Police Chief Please remember to not give out any personal information over the phone or online. Online scams are increasing where messages are being sent through social media requesting personal information. Social media can become very detrimental so be very cautious of what you share online.

We are also seeing an increase in scam phone calls involving callers stating that they are from your local police department and are requesting money. No police agency will ever call you and ask you for money over the phone. You should never give out financial information to anyone over the phone. If it sounds too good to be true, it is! Always call to report suspicious calls or messages to the police, 517-543-1552.



From the Fire Chief Prior to burning this spring and summer, don't forget to get a Burning Permit from the Charlotte Fire Department. This permit can be issued at either the West Side Fire Station or the Downtown Station, by calling (517) 543-0241, or online at https://www.charlottemifire.org/content/permits/.

The permit is issued at no cost.

Michigan Homeowner Assistance Fund (MIHAF). The Fund was established under section 3206 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (the ARP) to mitigate hardships associated with the coronavirus pandemic by providing funds to prevent homeowner mortgage delinquencies, defaults, foreclosure, loss of utilities or home energy services and displacements of homeowners experiencing financial hardship on or after January 21, 2020 or for those homeowners who experience a coronavirus pandemic financial hardship that began before January 21, 2020 but continued after that date. Emergency Home Repair Program. Eaton County administers an Emergency Repair Program. No interest, no payment loans to Eaton County residents who meet federal, state and County Housing Program guidelines may be provided. This program assists with emergency repairs that are causing a health and safety risk to the occupants and the structure of the home.

The program offers up to \$20,000 in no interest, no payment loan assistance to repair and improve program participant's home. A deferred mortgage is recorded against the property for the amount invested into the home. Lead Service Line Replacement. A survey of the city's water system is needed to comply with the amended Michigan Safe Drinking Water Act which was changed in 2018 to require all municipal drinking water providers to inventory their water lines by 2025.

Part of that work includes verifying the material of the water service inside the residence. Water service lines can be copper or plastic, but

some may be galvanized steel, iron, or lead.

While Charlotte has begun work on the outside portion of the project, a concerted effort will be undertaken soon to verify service material inside a home. If you would like to schedule an appointment for a city employee to verify your service, please call 517-543-8858.

A \$350,700 grant to assist in the effort to identify lead service leads has been obtained from EGLE. This work is mandated by the state, and more information about lead service lines can be found here: Michigan.gov lead and copper rule.

Mowing and Weeds. City rules require that grass and vegetation be maintained so as not to exceed 10 inches in height. A code enforcement inspector will take action on properties that are not maintained. They may also have weeds/grass cut at the property owner's expense. Please keep shrubs and trees trimmed back at corners to prevent traffic hazards, and away from sidewalks for pedestrian safety. Do not put lawn clippings or leaves in the road, alley, or gutters since they may clog storm drains, which can be costly to clear out.

Mirroring trends seen across the country, information recently released by the Michigan State Police Criminal Justice Information Center shows that, in 2021, Michigan saw increases in both the frequency and severity of traffic crashes over 2020, including:

- 15% increase in motor vehicle crashes.
- 17% increase in injuries.
- 10% increase in crashes with suspected serious injuries.
- 4% increase in fatalities overall, with a 10% increase in alcohol-related fatalities.

These increases come at a time when vehicle repair, replacement, and rental costs have also increased. National data collected by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics shows that, since January 2020: Vehicle repair costs are up 10.5%.; Used car and truck prices are up 52.1%.; New car and truck prices are up 15.2%.; Rental car prices are up 22%.

These increases, along with rising fuel prices, parts shortages, and other pandemic-related supply chain concerns, underscore the financial benefits of safe driving.


